

Pupil Premium Impact of 2016-17 Grant

In 2016-17 we received £62180 PP grant. This funding was used a variety of ways to diminish the gap in both attainment and progress between those pupils eligible for funding and those who are not.

Therefore, the grant was spent on three areas:

1. Providing academic interventions which targeted specific learning gaps through extra support and interventions within and out of class.
2. Improving the wellbeing of the children for example through providing services like counselling, lunch clubs, attendance officer to work with families and running peer mentoring opportunities like reading ambassadors.
3. Providing enrichment and engaging activities such as access to after school clubs, attendance on trips and residential and the subsidisation of fees like music lessons.

Summary of Attainment and Progress.

There were 11 pupils eligible for funding	EYFS % Good Level of Development

In 2015-16 25% of our PP children achieved a GLD. The gap between Hugglescote Pupil Premium pupils achieving a GLD in 2015-16 to the Local Authority was -20%.

In 2016-17 this gap closed and Hugglescote PP children are +16% above the Local Authority.

Disadvantaged pupils Phonics Year 1 2017

There were 5 pupils eligible for funding	Phonics pass rate %
Hugglescote Pupil Premium pupils	20%
Hugglescote non- Pupil Premium pupils	87%

This shows that pupils eligible for PP grant were working below the expected standard for phonics in Year 1. However, 4/5 children have SEND and internal tracking shows that this group made good progress from their starting points.

Disadvantaged pupils KS1 2017

Each Pupil Premium child is worth 17%. Therefore 4/6 reached expected standard in Reading and Maths. 1/6 achieved GDS in all 3 subjects. 2/6 have SEND one of whom moved to our school in the Spring Term of Year 2.

All children will receive additional support in Year 3 to diminish the gaps especially in writing.

Of the 6 pupils 2 moved to our school: one in Y5 and one in 6.

The pupil Premium children made better progress in Reading and writing than maths

Internal data showed that this group made accelerated progress in maths in Year 6 but did not perform well under test conditions. This remains a focus for support as well as improving the number of PP children achieving at GDS.

Please note than with less than 10 children in most year groups being eligible for the Pupil Premium grant, caution should be taken in analysing the data.
